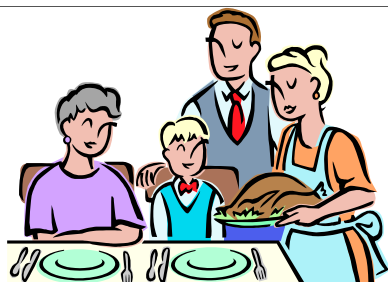
Lion Susie reported the pump on the side of the building is not working; water is rising and could cause damage inside club house. Lion J Mowery to purchase and replace with a new pump.

Foothill Lions Club of Loma Rica Amblyopia (Lazy Eye) Testing:

The Foothill Lion’s Club of Loma Rica has entered into a partnership with the **Marysville Joint Unified School District Health Services Department**. **Mrs. Christine Beermann** from the Lion’s Club Chairs this effort and communicates regularly with **Mrs. Pam Barnhill** from Health Services. We are the only **Lion’s Club** in **Northern California** that offers this testing for **Kindergarten** and **Pre-School** children. We have started our free testing with the **Foothill Schools** in

Browns Valley, Challenge, Hallwood and

Dobbins in March 2010. Since we have

been testing the children in this area, there have been many questions, which I will try to answer in this paper.



Let’s define the word **Amblyopia**, it literally means “**dim vision**”. It is generally in one eye, but can be both eyes. Many people confuse Amblyopia with **Strabismus (crossed eyes)**. Strabismus is physically noticeable in a child and is caused by weak eye muscles not holding the eye in place in the socket. This can cause “lazy eye” but does not always result in Amblyopia. Our testing has found at least one child with symptoms of lazy eye and several children with possible lazy eye or vision problems at every school we have visited. Mrs. Barnhill is using this free testing and information to inform the parents of the need to have a professional ophthalmologist check their child and follow up with vision issues. If this issue is left untreated, it can lead to blindness in one eye in adults. This affects depth perception and quality of life. There are many non-surgical treatments for Amblyopia, primarily a simple opaque eye patch that covers the strong eye to force the weak eye to work harder and get

stronger vision. Glasses, eye drops and vision therapy are other forms of treatment. Surgery is considered a last resort. Mrs. Barnhill is documenting all the findings of poor vision that the Lions Club and regular annual eye testing is finding and sending information sheets home to the parents of those who exhibit symptoms of vision problems. The Foothill Lion’s Club is also available to assist families who need financial assistance with funding to see a professional eye doctor.

I am happy to report that interest in CCI, the Canine Companions for Independence, which provides trained dogs for the disabled, continues to grow. Some of you are now familiar with the S.H.A.R.E.S. cards which are used when you make purchases at Save Mart or Food Max. The cards are free; just hand the card to the cashier when going thru the checkout with your purchases. Your total amount is sent directly to their Headquarters, and every quarter, 3% of total purchases are sent to the Club for CCI. We have been enrolled in this fund raiser since last July and have received \$132.03 to date.

Over 100 cards are now in use and we continue providing cards to anyone who asks for them. Remember, anyone who wants to support the program can use a card for this purpose, so be sure to ask your friends and neighbors if they would like to help, at no cost to them. The cards are free and can be replaced if lost. Another fund raiser in progress is placement of collection boxes with pictures of the CCI dogs on them in local businesses, these now include Loma Rica Store, Gold Eagle Market, Lizzy's Feed, Elliott's Photo, Gaiser Pet, Maggie Capitano's Farmer's Insurance, Pet Smart, Tropical Paradise Grooming, and the Territorial Dispatch.
